Who Can Join 4-H?



4-H MEMBERSHIP

4-H grade is determined as of October 1, 2019.

- 5 year-old Kindergartners, first & second graders (*as of* 10/01/2019) enroll in Dodge County 4-H as Cloverbuds.
- 3rd graders enroll as *Explorers* and can add 1 additional project (optional).
- Starting in 4th grade, members can select from a list of projects.
- 4-H membership is open to all youth beginning in 5K (fiveyear-old Kindergarten) through one year beyond high school graduation and not to extend beyond the age of 19 as of December 31 of the enrollment year.

Member graduation option:

- Graduate from 4-H upon high school graduation -or-
- One year <u>after</u> high school graduation.

4-H MEMBERSHIP/COMPETITION POLICY WISCONSIN 4-H YOUTH DEVELOPMENT POLICIES

Revised June 2017

- 1.Youth must annually sign the WI 4-H Youth Development Code of Conduct. Consequences for violating any part of this Code of Conduct may include, but are not limited to:
- •Removal from participation in the event in which the Code of Conduct has been violated (at the individual's expense)
- •Suspension of membership
- •Sanctions on participation in future 4-H events
- •Forfeiture or repayment of financial support for the event
- •Loss of status as a "member" in good standing."

2. "Member in good standing" is a youth who abides by the Code of Conduct and meets group or educational project participation requirements and deadlines.

3. Youth may hold 4-H membership in no more than one county or state at the same time.

4. Youth must qualify for participation in regional, state, or national 4-H competitions through their county of membership.

- This statement does not prohibit a county from using an event in another county as the place where their members qualify for a regional or state competition. It does mean that members must be selected as representatives of only their county of membership, regardless of the location of the qualifying experience.
- Youth must be enrolled in 4-H at the time the event/program occurs.
- Participation is limited to those members who are in "good standing" with their local 4-H club and county.

DEADLINE TO RE-ENROLL IN DODGE COUNTY 4-H: November 1, 2019

4HOnline—A Useful Tool for ALL 4-H Families

4HOnline is not just for enrollment! Families can use this webbased program to read their 4-H newsletter, receive communications from your county 4-H office, and update your member's health form for 4-H events. The Dodge County 4-H Office uses the broadcast email feature to keep 4-H families up to date on important announcements and reminders.

If your address, phone number or email address changes, YOU can enter your email and password to change/update information in your family or member profile. 4-H PROJECTS **cannot** be changed.

To complete a youth's Health Form, view the newsletter, or change contact information, just follow these steps: 1.go to https://wi.4honline.com

- 2.enter your family's email
- 3.Enter the password (the same one used to enroll last fall)
- 4.Login and your Family's Page will appear

New Members (*including Cloverbuds and Explorers*) should enter their 4HOnline enrollment and pay all enrollment and project fees to their local General Leader as soon as they have decided to become members of a club. Once 4HOnline Enrollment is completed projects **CANNOT** be added or changed after December 31st.

Reminder: Family profile and member information should be entered by a parent/guardian unless the member enrolling is 18 years or older.

MAS Project Member Activity Card (Orange Card)

Four educational points <u>AND</u> attendance at either a postfair or pre-fair meeting are required by the MAS committee for the education point card. The "4" points are required and can be obtained by attending educational livestock events. AT LEAST 2 of the points need to be gotten at a county or state educational event. For some youth who have no means to have "local club" learning events, it is always possible to have all 4 or more points obtained from county or state events.

If an "out of county" event is where a point will be obtained, use the back of the card to explain the event <u>AND</u> obtain a signature that can be identified so a call may be given if the committee has questions.

No educational event may give a youth more than **1** educational points (even if other county's youth obtain 2+ points for such an event).

Youth attending college may obtain a point for agricultural events attended by obtaining MAS committee approval.
