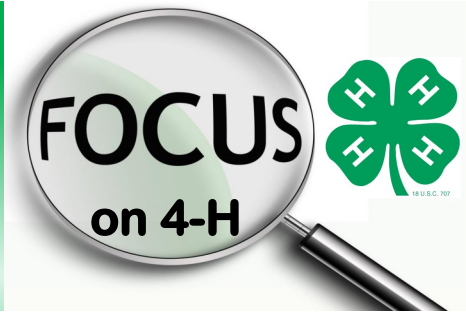

•October 6-12: National 4-H Week (Theme: *Inspire Kids to Do*)

During National 4-H Week, *Inspire Kids to Do* highlights how 4-H encourages kids to take part in hands-on learning experiences in areas such as health, science, agriculture and civic engagement. The positive environment provided by 4-H mentors ensures that kids in every county and parish in the country—from urban neighborhoods to suburban schoolyards to rural farming communities—are encouraged to take on proactive leadership roles and are empowered with the skills to lead in life and career.

•October 1- 31, 2019: 4-H National Youth Science Day sees hundreds of thousands of youth across the nation taking part in the world's largest youth-led STEM challenge. The exciting theme for this year's challenge is **Game Changers**, which will run throughout October. Developed by Google and West Virginia University Extension Service, **Game Changers** will teach kids coding skills through fun exercises including gaming, puzzles and physical activity. Who Can Join 4-H?

4HOnline

**4-H MEMBERSHIP**

4-H grade is determined as of October 1, 2019.

- 5 year-old Kindergartners, first & second graders (*as of 10/01/2019*) enroll in Dodge County 4-H as Cloverbuds.
- 3rd graders enroll as *Explorers* and can add 1 additional project (optional).
- Starting in 4th grade, members can select from a list of projects.
- 4-H membership is open to all youth beginning in 5K (five-year-old Kindergarten) through one year beyond high school graduation and not to extend beyond the age of 19 as of December 31 of the enrollment year.

Member graduation option:

- Graduate from 4-H upon high school graduation -or-
- One year after high school graduation.

4-H MEMBERSHIP/COMPETITION POLICY**WISCONSIN 4-H YOUTH DEVELOPMENT POLICIES**

Revised June 2017

1. Youth must annually sign the WI 4-H Youth Development Code of Conduct. Consequences for violating any part of this Code of Conduct may include, but are not limited to:
 - Removal from participation in the event in which the Code of Conduct has been violated (at the individual’s expense)
 - Suspension of membership
 - Sanctions on participation in future 4-H events
 - Forfeiture or repayment of financial support for the event
 - Loss of status as a “member” in good standing.”
2. “Member in good standing” is a youth who abides by the Code of Conduct and meets group or educational project participation requirements and deadlines.
3. Youth may hold 4-H membership in no more than one county or state at the same time.
4. Youth must qualify for participation in regional, state, or national 4-H competitions through their county of membership.
 - This statement does not prohibit a county from using an event in another county as the place where their members qualify for a regional or state competition. It does mean that members must be selected as representatives of only their county of membership, regardless of the location of the qualifying experience.
 - Youth must be enrolled in 4-H at the time the event/program occurs.
 - Participation is limited to those members who are in “good standing” with their local 4-H club and county.

DEADLINE TO RE-ENROLL IN DODGE COUNTY 4-H: November 1, 2019

4HOnline—A Useful Tool for ALL 4-H Families

4HOnline is not just for enrollment! Families can use this web-based program to read their 4-H newsletter, receive communications from your county 4-H office, and update your member’s health form for 4-H events. The Dodge County 4-H Office uses the broadcast email feature to keep 4-H families up to date on important announcements and reminders.

If your address, phone number or email address changes, YOU can enter your email and password to change/update information in your family or member profile. 4-H PROJECTS **cannot** be changed.

To complete a youth’s Health Form, view the newsletter, or change contact information, just follow these steps:

1. go to <https://wi.4honline.com>
2. enter your family’s email
3. Enter the password (the same one used to enroll last fall)
4. Login and your Family’s Page will appear

New Members (*including Cloverbuds and Explorers*) should enter their 4HOnline enrollment and pay all enrollment and project fees to their local General Leader as soon as they have decided to become members of a club. Once 4HOnline Enrollment is completed projects **CANNOT** be added or changed after December 31st.

Reminder: *Family profile and member information should be entered by a parent/guardian unless the member enrolling is 18 years or older.*

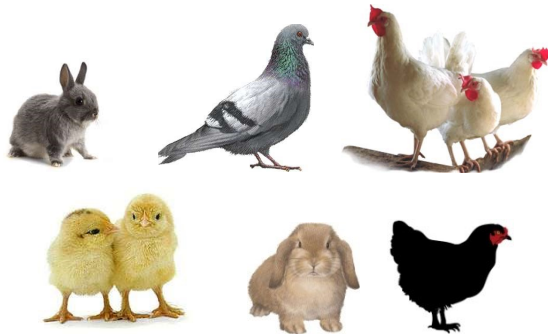

MAS Project Member Activity Card (Orange Card)

- **Four educational points AND attendance at either a post-fair or pre-fair meeting** are required by the MAS committee for the education point card. The "4" points are required and can be obtained by attending educational livestock events.
- **AT LEAST 2** of the points need to be gotten at a county or state educational event. For some youth who have no means to have "local club" learning events, it is always possible to have all 4 or more points obtained from county or state events.
- If an "out of county" event is where a point will be obtained, use the back of the card to explain the event AND obtain a signature that can be identified so a call may be given if the committee has questions.
- No educational event may give a youth more than **1** educational points (even if other county's youth obtain 2+ points for such an event).
- Youth attending college may obtain a point for agricultural events attended by obtaining MAS committee approval.
