

4 Steps Necessary to Becoming a Certified WI 4-H Volunteer The safety of all youth and adults is our top priority. To ensure volunteers are qualified, understand, and are prepared for their positions, Extension requires:

Annually, signing the Extension Volunteer Behavior Expectation form and the Assumption

Complete the Extension Volunteer Mandated Reporter Training online

of Risk Document. This is typically done as part of the registration process. Volunteers In Preparation (VIP) Training - once, with ongoing virtual and in person

· Background check - first year and every 4 years after

A NEW 4-H volunteer will need to complete the steps above. First, enroll in 4HOnline as a volunteer 4-H leader and sign the volunteer behavior expectation form. Once that is done, you'll receive an email from UW Madison explaining that you will next be receiving an email from "HireRight," and they will be asking you to complete a criminal background

check. Next, you will need to complete the online Mandated Reporter Training and the
