Season's greetings from Extension Forestry. My name is Tony Johnson, and I am a forestry outreach specialist and maple syrup program manager. I say the same thing every season, but it really is a great time of year to be outside. I encourage folks across the badger state to bundle up and spend some time in the woods this winter. With leaves mostly down, winter provides a different, bug-free, perspective to consider opportunities to promote wildlife, recreation, and the next generation of trees in the forest.

If you ever have questions about your own woodlands, consider reaching out to your local WI DNR service forester. Every county in Wisconsin has a private lands service forester available to assist landowners with property walk-throughs and no-strings attached advice on all thing's woodlands. If you're interested in taking your forestry knowledge and skills to the next level while staying indoors this winter, the Extension Forestry Program has a webinar series for you. Starting January 9th and running through the end of February, we're hosting online lunch hour classes about invasive species impacts and management, promoting songbird and herptile habitat, creating a forestry plan and accessing financial and technical assistance to make that plan a reality.
