#### **Beef x Dairy Management Workshops**

The University of Wisconsin-Madison Division of Extension, in cooperation with the UW-Madison Animal and Dairy Science Department, will be hosting four in-person Beef X Dairy-focused workshops from July 29 – August



1, 2024. These workshops will provide Wisconsin's dairy producers and cattle feeders with research-based information on nutrition, feedlot management, and carcass composition for beef x dairy crossbred cattle. Our featured speaker will be Jerad Jaborek, Beef Feedlot Systems Educator with Michigan State University, who has conducted research on beef x dairy crossbred cattle. # Nitrogen crediting from multi-species covers planted after wheat

Multi-species cover crops planted after wheat are becoming more popular as farmers look to mix the benefits from different types of cover crops: erosion control, soil health, nitrogen scavenging, and nitrogen fixation, to name a few. While there are **university guidelines** for the nitrogen credits from single species legume plantings, there is a lack of research of what happens to nitrogen crediting to the following corn crop if legumes are part of a larger mix. UW Extension in partnership with the Michael Fields Agriculture Institute is collaborating with three farmers in Dodge County and three in Dane County to conduct on-farm research aimed at answering these questions of



nitrogen crediting and the larger soil health effects of these multi-species cover crops after wheat.


#### **Mooving Cows: Learn Basic Cow Handling Skills**
