Needs Assessment

- Youth have an opportunity to explore their spark(s)
- Mentorship programs where older youth (ages 15-24) can mentor or volunteer for younger generations.
- Youth engagement increases in county level programming

Updates from the community needs forum:

- Attended the Dodge County Benefits and Wellness Fair. We had a display of Extension programs and offerings for the county employees. Shared a educational coloring book for families with young children to talk about mental health issues with their children.
- Attended sessions at the National 4-H Educators conference to learn about partners and resources for teaching youth about mental health.

National 4-H Week:

National 4-H week is a great week to promote what happens in the 4-H program.

- Created several news releases that were sent to the media, a club participated in the community service which was promoted in the newsletter and on Facebook,
- Did a 40 minute live stream program on Hometown today Hometown today program on WBEV radio streaming live at https://dailydodge.com/audio/hometown-today-audio/ on October 9, 2025
- Asked for participant feedback on the Dodge 4-H Facebook and Extension Facebook. Prizes were given to the people who responded to Facebook prompts on the 4-H and Extension Facebook page.

Club Officer Training:

An officer training session for 4-H youth club officers, where 22 participants—ranging from grades 3 through high school and including a few adult leaders—engaged in role-specific workshops and a general leadership session. Participants learned key skills such as parliamentary procedure, meeting facilitation, financial management, and teamwork strategies. To build confidence, strengthen club operations, and empower youth to take active leadership roles in their clubs.

Participant Feedback Highlights:

- Skill Development: Youth reported learning how to write and present secretary reports, manage club finances responsibly, and use parliamentary terminology effectively.
- Teamwork & Communication: Many noted the importance of working together, speaking up, and using icebreakers to engage shy members.
- **General Session Impact:** Participants appreciated learning how teamwork improves club dynamics, how to resolve conflicts, and how to make meetings more inclusive and productive.
- Overall Experience: Comments included "really fun," "helpful and fun," "good session," and "this helped me quite a bit," reflecting strong engagement and satisfaction.

Sparks Research and Teaching

- Continuing to work with a couple of colleagues on Sparks Lesson plan to share statewide to help youth identify their sparks.
- Focused the Fall Cloverbud series on Sparks for youth to try out some of the different 4-H project areas.
